The Juvenile Crime Prevention Council having studied the needs of juveniles in the county hereby publishes this Request for Proposals.

The North Carolina Department of Public Safety (NCDPS) anticipates annual funds in the above stated amount will be available for programs serving delinquent and at-risk youth beginning on or after July 1, 2021. Local match rate for JCPC funds required: 20%. *

**The Juvenile Crime Prevention Council may recommend certain programs for one or two-year funding awards dependent upon program performance, compliance with JCPC policy, and the availability of state JCPC allocation funds.*

Based on identified needed programs and possible gaps in the service continuum, the following program types will be considered for funding:

- Teen Court
- Mediation (Restorative Justice)

As a result of the Needs Assessment in the above-named county, programs that reduce risk, address the needs of juveniles, and increase protective factors will be considered for funding.

Elevated Risk Factors for delinquency:

- Association with other delinquent peers or peers involved with gangs
- Peer relationship problems and conflict
- Moderate to serious behavioral problems at school
- Prior assaultive behavior
- Involvement in alcohol and substance use
- Prior referrals to juvenile court
- Referral to juvenile court prior to age 12
- Inadequate supervision by parents/guardians

Elevated Needs for adjudicated juveniles:

- Association with delinquent peers involved with gangs; peer relationship problems and conflict
- Mental health needs including school behavior problems; involvement in alcohol/substance use; referral/involvement with juvenile court prior to age 12; some association with delinquent peers
- Inadequate supervision by parents/guardians
- Moderate to serious behavioral problems at school

Protective Factors to address risk and needs:

1. Program services compatible with research that are shown to be effective with juvenile offenders.
2. Program services are outcome-based.
3. The program has an evaluation component.
4. Program services detect gang participate and divert individuals, if applicable.
